DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

This area is underlain by Bridge River Series, greenstone being apparently the main rock type. The mineralization is associated with shearing in the greenstone which, in one case, continues along the contact of greenstone and sediments, mainly argillites and cherty quartzites. The shearing is generally irregular, strikes being northeasterly with northwesterly dips varying from 35° to 65°.

Mineralization consists chiefly of pyrite and sphalerite, the latter occurring as massive streaks and bunches or in disseminations. The gangue is composed of ankerite carbonate accompanied by quartz and calcite. Assays of several selected samples range from a trace to 0.30 oz./ton gold; 0.4 to 2.7 oz./ton silver; and 1.5 to 10.4% zinc.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The Peerless Group is situated near the south end of Tyaughton Lake between 3,300 and 3,440 feet elevation, about 6 miles north of Goldbridge. It consisted of 13 claims and fractions held by location.

The showings were discovered in the early 1930's and in 193 the group was owned by Peerless Gold Mines, Limited. Development work at the time consisted of trenches, an incline shaft o unknown depths and two adits. The lower adit was 289 feet in length with 50 feet of branch workings; the upper adit was 17 feet in length.
